



## **The Groton Community School Scholarship In Memory of Taylor Benjamin Young**

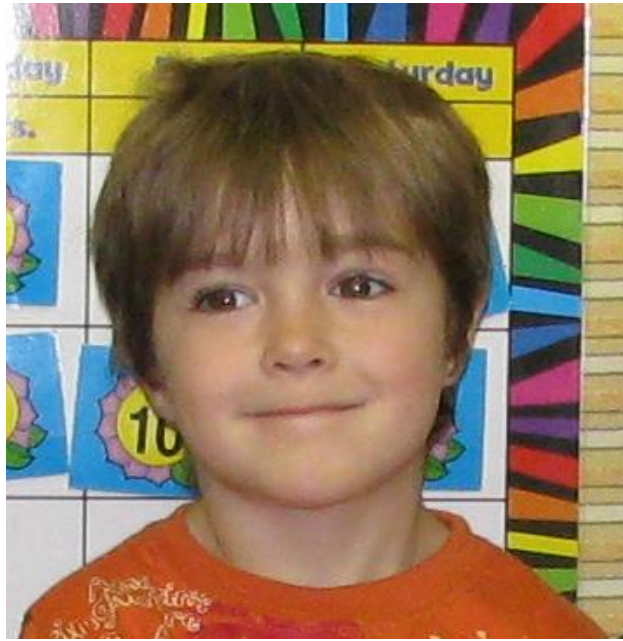
The Groton Community School is beginning an annual scholarship which will be awarded to a graduating high school senior who is one of our Groton Community School alumni. The scholarship is in memory of Taylor Benjamin Young, a beloved and treasured Groton Community School student who lost his life at the tender age of four. The award recipient will also exemplify the qualities, described below, demonstrated by Taylor during his life.

### **Scholarship Guidelines**

- 1) The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating high school senior who is an alumnus/ alumna of Groton Community School.
- 2) The recipient will exemplify the qualities demonstrated by Taylor Benjamin Young.
- 3) A \$500 scholarship will be awarded.
- 4) To be considered, the following materials must be submitted to the GCS Scholarship Committee, 110 Boston Road, Groton, MA on or before Friday, March 30, 2012:
  - a. A completed application form.
  - b. A copy of the student's transcript.
  - c. A list of extracurricular and community activities.
  - d. An essay describing how the candidate exemplifies the qualities demonstrated by Taylor.
  - e. A letter of reference from a teacher or other mentor.
