Our daughter attended Kindergarten at Groton Community School in part because we were looking for a new home in the area at the time and we didn't know what town we'd end up in and did not want to end up pulling her out of school as well. We'd loved the experience our family had from the time she was in the toddler room all the way through pre-k. She was also a regular "big roomer" at GCS. We knew that no matter where our new house was, our daughter would be in a place where she was comfortable at school. As for many other families, tuition was a consideration, but it was one more year and we knew she would get a great education. The class size could not be beat! ...She had a very close class. The children learned to be responsible not only for their own things, but for their time as well. They had tasks in each area of study to accomplish each day. They also had homework most nights. They had an opportunity to continue with the Lively Letters program, and even did a show at "Graduation"

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for their families. They learned how to create their own books, which parents got to read and the children were very proud of. Incidentally, when our daughter got to first grade and their class created their own books, it was nothing for her, because it was already something she'd learned how to do. They had many opportunities to be themselves and be creative and not be so regimented as in public schools, where classes are larger and the main focus is really on control of the class, not the individual child. Our daughter really started first grade ahead of her peers academically as well as socially.

In addition, there were so many extras that GCS Kindergartners participate in. They continue their relationship with Patty Barr (Creative Movement Instructor), as well as with the other teachers that they are already familiar with. They have a great opportunity for mentoring the younger children, whether on the playground or in the big room. They also went on a number of field trips and performed special shows for their schoolmates and families as well as attendees of RiverCourt adult day care facility in West Groton... I believe the children also felt a great sense of accomplishment after their shows and it made them feel good to know that they brightened the days of so many people. Also, as a parent, it is so great to be able to stop by any time unannounced and help out in the classroom or share lunch or snack with the children.
