# Six not-to-be-missed homes will be on our tour this year:

### **HOME NUMBER 1**

This impressive 6,700 square-foot estate boasts must-see features on both the inside and outside, including a 1,100 square-foot porch overlooking a custom waterfall and relaxing koi pond. Mahogany double doors, meticulous stonework, detailed millwork, hickory flooring and top-of-the-line appliances are just some of the features of this five-bedroom home, which includes two laundry rooms and two master suites, complete with personal fireplaces.

#### **HOME NUMBER 2**

Not one, not two, but three staircases can carry you to the second floor of this 28-year old New England Colonial that has been renovated and updated over the past ten years to create the ideal setting for entertaining with family and friends. The exquisite custom interior design curated by the homeowner herself fits this home seamlessly, giving each room its own distinctive character. Complete with a billiard room and wine cellar, you can't miss a chance to see this hidden gem!

### HOME NUMBER 3

Located in one of the area's most prestigious neighborhoods, this admirably maintained colonial with a charming farmers porch has it all, from the superior quality throughout the inside to a four-season room with beautiful views of the surrounding conservation land. The sprawling kitchen was built with snowflake antique-finished cabinetry and granite countertops and allows impeccable views of the tranquil setting outside. Don't miss the timeless gas stove and pieces of antique furniture throughout the house, all of which were carefully restored by the owners.

#### **HOME NUMBER 4**

Step back in to the 19<sup>th</sup> century as you experience this home, thoughtfully restored to bring it back to the time when one of Massachusetts' most renowned politicians lived there. From the second floor library with a bow window to the large collection of political and legal books, this home has the same feel as the one that was visited by President Ulysses S. Grant in 1869. #### **HOME NUMBER 5**

This 1830 Greek Revival farmhouse underwent renovations and a relocation in 2003, and now boasts the perfect combination of a historical homestead with modern updates. While the result is a magnificent, historical farmhouse that preserved both the exterior and interior distinctive features of the original home, the backdrop is even more

This 1800s home, with its main portion dating from the time of John Adam's presidency, has been newly renovated.
