HOME NUMBER 1

The antique house was built in 1811, but has undergone a massive transformation in the last year, including an addition to the back of the home, a pool, and impeccable landscaping. Home to eight fireplaces total, this residence has nods to its history throughout the living space, including the classic woodwork on the main stairway. In constructing a kitchen and living space on the back of the home, the owners meticulously matched the flooring for a seamless look that will take you straight out to the stunning views of Gibbet Hill.

This antique home perched right in downtown Groton is outwardly a quintessential New England home and deservedly so; its roots date as far back to 1780. HOME NUMBER 3

It is hard to believe the homeowners moved into this home just three short years ago. This expansive, 6,500-square foot Georgian Colonial is impressive, delightful, and surprising at every turn, showing off the homeowners' wide-ranging style, love for history, and focus on family in the most intricate of ways. Be sure not to miss the latest addition to the home, a 1930s-era antique apothecary numbered cabinet once used to hold tools that has now become a stunning centerpiece of the first floor den!

HOME NUMBER 4

Nestled into a secluded corner of idyllic Dunstable, the owners of this Cape Cod-style farmhouse have incorporated seamless updates to the property, which overlooks 90 acres of corn and hay fields, since moving there in 1976. Before leaving this quaint home, make sure to check out the barn, which stores 6,000 bales of hay and machinery. While outside, take a close look at the newly restored tractor outside the barn. Purchased in the 1950s, the tractor was one of the first used by the homeowner on the family farm, and was restored to its original glory within the last 10 years. And, yes — it still works!

HOME NUMBER 5

To say this English Manor home, built in 1980, has been transformed in recent years is an understatement. The restoration encompassed every inch of the 5,000-square foot home nestled among 6 acres, which is evident from your entry onto the property. Upon entry through the custom-made front doors of the home, your eye is immediately trained upward at the grand double staircase, which received new railings and step lighting in the renovation process.
