Dear GCS Families,

We are writing to express our gratitude to you for sharing your children with us this school year especially, and also to thank you for your partnership in keeping our GCS Community healthy and safe. We are doing our best to ensure that Groton Community School stays open on site to serve the educational and childcare needs of our children and families.

Just a reminder that the *Addendum to our GCS Family Handbook* with FAQ regarding COVID-19 policies and procedures at GCS is posted on the Family Login page <a href="www.grotoncommunityschool.org/family-login/">www.grotoncommunityschool.org/family-login/</a> with password "GCS2021fam". You can also find the most recent requirements and information from our state licensing agency, The Department of Early Education and Care (EEC). The top line facts remain the same, stay home if sick, wear masks, practice hand hygiene and of course let us know if your child or a household member has COVID-19 symptoms or has had close contact with a COVID-19 positive individual in the last 14 days. Please notify GCS if your child will be absent for any reason.

With the Thanksgiving holiday upon us, we are asking families and staff to be mindful of gatherings. The EEC Commissioner has also requested that we share the most recent State Travel Order with families:

## **Travel Order Reminder**

The <u>CDC</u> has advised against traveling at this time and in MA, the Travel Order that took effect on August 1<sup>st</sup> remains in effect even during the holiday season. More information on the Travel Order can be <u>found here</u>.

The travel order requires people (re)entering Massachusetts from non-lower risk states (a list of which can be found <a href="here">here</a> to quarantine for 14 days or produce a negative COVID-19 test from a test taken within 72 hours prior to arrival. Travelers under the age of 10 do not need to get a test if the adults in their travel party have negative tests and may return to their child care program upon return. If a travel party cannot produce a negative test, the entire party, including children under the age of 10, must quarantine for 14 days. Children that must quarantine after travel may not attend child care until they have completed the quarantine.

We have much to be thankful for, with a proactive Governor and administration working in concert with educational agencies, and a number of vaccines on the horizon. There is a light at the end of the tunnel peeking through, but as numbers rise throughout the country, we are still in the midst of the crisis, and it is imperative that we all follow state guidance.
